Dress Code	 In an effort to improve the atmosphere for learning, students will dress in a manner that reflects positively on themselves, their parents and their school. No revealing clothing, i.e. strapless, see-through, too-short, muscle tanks, etc. (All clothing must have sleeves)
	 No racy, violent or inappropriate logos or accessories Clothing must be a good fit (not over-sized or sagging) and be in good repair (no holes or rips). No slippers or pajamas No hats or hoods allowed
Electronic Devices/ Confiscated Items	 To ensure the educational process is not disrupted, to protect personal property, and to promote school safety, ALL electronic devices and hats must be off and put away from 7 a.m. to 2:48 p.m. or they will be confiscated. The school is not responsible for any lost or stolen electronic devices. The first time an item is confiscated, student must serve a 20-minute detention before the item can be picked up.
Honor Code	• Students will not receive aid on tests or quizzes; will not give or receive unpermitted aid on class work, reports or papers, or on any other work given as a graded assignment. Students will take responsibility to uphold and encourage others to uphold the
	Honor Code. Violation of the honor code makes students ineligible for honors such as Daisy Chain and graduation honors. Teachers will clearly state their expectations regarding permitted and unpermitted aid on assignments, both in and outside of class.
Out-of-Bounds/ (Truancy	Designated areas of campus are closed to students during assemblies, breaks, lunch and pep rallies. Out-of-bounds areas include, but are not limited to, the Grossmont District Offices, parking lots, athletic fields, and areas surrounding the campus. If a student is caught off campus they could receive a daytime loitering ticket from the ECPD.
Cafe-S ((Student Support & Suspension)	Students at Grossmont are expected to demonstrate FOOTHILLER PRIDE by conduct- ing themselves in an appropriate manner inside and outside the classroom. These behav- ior guidelines are as follows: Students must demonstrate Respect for Themselves, Re- spect for Others, and Respect for their Community. Failure to behave in this man- ner may lead to Cafe-S where you will be asked to reflect on your behavior with an adult. Frequent visitations to Cafe-S it will result in a behavior referral and/or Saturday School.
